DEKALB COUNTY BASEBALL HISTORY

From the first designated hitter in major league baseball history to a pair of overall No. 1 professional draft picks, DeKalb County's baseball history is a long and proud one.

Ron Blomberg is perhaps the most famous name among DeKalb County's elite list of baseball participants.

A 1968 graduate of Druid Hills, Blomberg was the first player selected in the 1968 major league baseball draft.

Blomberg played eight years in the majors with the New York Yankees and Chicago White Sox, becoming baseball's first designated hitter and had a .293 career average.

Walker product **Mike Ivie** followed Blomberg on the local scene two years later and was selected No. 1 in the pro baseball draft by the San Diego Padres.

Henderson's **Pete Ladd** (1974), Sequoyah's **David Beard** (1977), Redan's **Wally Joyner** (1980) and Redan's **Brandon Phillips** (1999) are among the other DeKalb graduates that went on to star in professional baseball.

The list of team accomplishments is equally impressive, beginning with Avondale's state championship in 1952.

Coach **Lyman Howard** guided the Blue Devils to the Class A crown that year, defeating Thomasville (15-8) in the final to complete a stellar 24-5 campaign.

Tucker has captured the most state titles of any DeKalb County school, claiming three overall state triumphs in the 1956, 1966 and 1967 seasons.

D.D. Brooks served as the head skipper in 1956 for a Tiger squad that capped a strong 15-1 campaign with a 12-8 victory over Wacona in the class B final.

Ed Tatum, meanwhile, coached the victorious Tucker state championship teams of 1966 and 1967.

Avondale won again under **Tip Goza** in 1964 (AAA), while Walker (1968; AA), Sequoyah (1972; AA) and Henderson (1974; AAA) ran DeKalb County's state title list to six over an 11-year period from 1964-74.

Dunwoody ended a 33-year dryspell on the local front by sweeping Columbus (7-5 and 6-0) in the 2007 AAA final to finish a 34-4 state title run under **Tom Bass** in 2007.

Redan (30-7) returned the state glory to the local front in 2013, rolling past Marist in the final by the scores of 11-0 and 4-3 to claim the AAAA crown for **Marvin Pruitt**.

Famous coaches include **Marvin Pruitt** (1983-2014 at Lakeside, Southwest DeKalb, Stephenson and Redan), **John Devore** (1969-96 at Southwest DeKalb and Shamrock,

Don Burgess (1976-2004 at Druid Hills and Henderson), **Lee Medwick** at Towers (1982-2004), **Jim Levie** (1977-2000 at Peachtree, Clarkston and Stone Mountain), **Ron Elgin** (1978-2003 at Walker, Lakeside and Lithonia), **Robert Nowell** (1960-89 at Druid Hills, Sequoyah and Briarcliff), **Tony Palma** (1948-75 at Chamblee), **Sam Edenfield**

(1968-89 at Cross Keys), **Rick Kneisel** (1982-94 at Peachtree and Dunwoody), **Tom Bass** at Dunwoody (1995-2009), **Greg Goodwin** (1989-2000) at Redan, **David Roman**

ABOUT THE COVER

The cover for the 2020 DeKalb County Baseball Media Guide is a tribute to former long-time DeKalb County head baseball coach Marvin Pruitt. The Avondale graduate, who passed away in 2019, won 510 games over 31 years as a head coach. DeKalb County School District Athletic Specialist **Mark Brock** shot these pictures along with most of the team group photos shown inside taken at 2020 DeKalb County Baseball Media Day.

DEKALB COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The DeKalb County School District has nineteen high schools that field teams in interscholastic sports. DeKalb schools compete in six of the seven classifications of the Georgia High School Association: one is in AAAAAAA, four are in AAAAAA, eight are AAAAA, one is AAAA, four are in AAA and one is in AA. The 2020 region alignments are listed on page 5.

The DeKalb County School District, one of Georgia's largest, serves more than 100,000 (K-12) living in a 258 square-mile area in the east and northeast sections of metro Atlanta. DeKalb provides diverse educational programs and services operating on a semester basis. The system includes 83 elementary schools, 20 middle schools and 21 high schools, special service centers for foreign language, science, vocational-technical, educational computing, special education, early childhood, learning resource and performing arts.

GAME TIMES

Baseball games played in DeKalb County during the school week prior to Daylight Savings are scheduled for 4:30 p.m. and after that at 5 p.m. Games are seven innings in length. Due to weather conditions in the spring, games are often rescheduled due to poor playing conditions. It is recommended that you call the host school to confirm the date and location. All teams play at their home school except Druid Hills, which will once again be playing it's home schedule at Druid Hills Middle School.

ADMISSION

The county does not charge for regular season varsity and junior varsity baseball games. Regions set their own prices for the playoff games. Some regular season tournaments charge admission. Admission for the state playoffs set by the Georgia High School Association is \$7.00 at the gate.

RECORDS

Season records, single game records, hitting and pitching statistics have been kept by the Athletic Department since 1981. Baseball statistics are compiled on a weekly basis during the season. Records prior to 1981 appearing in the guide have been turned into the Athletic Department by individual coaches.

QUALIFYING MARKS

To be listed among the top hitters in DeKalb County and qualify for the county batting title, a batter must have 50 official at bats. This was raised from 35 in 1983. Pitchers are ranked on earned run average. To qualify, a pitcher must have at least 30 innings.

CEDAR GROVE'S BYRD REACHES 100 IN FINAL SEASON

McNair High School graduate **Lavato Byrd** closed out his head baseball coaching career in style while picking up an historic victory during the 2019 season.

The long-time Cedar Grove leader entered the year needing four victories to hit the magical number of 100 and reached that destination in a 13-3 home triumph over Columbia March 8.

Byrd served as the head coach at Cedar Grove for 12 years overall, finishing as the second winningest coach in school history with a final mark of 106-168-2.

Along with reaching 100 regular season victories, Byrd also ended Cedar Grove's 23-year streak of failing to qualify for the state playoffs during the 2015 campaign.

The Saints earned the No. 4 seed out of rugged Region 5-AAA that year, falling to Westside of Augusta in the first round on the road by the respective scores of 13-1 and 16-2 in finishing 10-12-1 overall for the year.

Byrd produced three seasons of 10 or more victories overall, highlighted by the stellar 15-11 showing of the 2014 squad.

Cedar Grove remained consistently competitive throughout Byrd's tenure, winning eight or more games in the nine campaigns of 2010 (9-14), 2011 (9-14), 2012 (9-15), 2013 (8-15), 2014, 2015, 2016 (9-11), 2017 (9-13) and 2019 (10-12).

DEKALB MAJOR LEAGUERS

Brandon Phillips - Redan High School. Phillips played 17 years as a second baseman in the major leagues. The 1999 Raider graduate finished with 211 homers, 368 doubles, 35 triples, 209 stolen bases, 2029 hits, 951 RBI, 1005 runs scored and a .275 batting average over 7378 at-bats. He also won four gold gloves over 1902 games.

Dominic Brown - Redan High School. Brown last competed on the AAA level of the Mexican leagues during the 2018 season, playing for the Tecolotes de los Dos Laredos. The outfielder compiled a .265 batting average with 18 homers, 65 RBI, 54 runs scored and 15 doubles over the 86 games he played.

Chris Nelson - Redan High School. The Raider graduate played on the AAA level for the second straight year in 2016, this time for Albuquerque in the Colorado organization. Nelson registered three homers, 33 RBI, five doubles and a .232 batting average.

Xavier Avery - Cedar Grove High School. Avery returned home for the 2017 campaign, having signed a minor league deal with the Atlanta Braves. The outfielder played for Baltimore's AAA club in Norfolk in 2016, posting six homers, 19 RBI, 38 runs scored, 15 doubles, 18 stolen bases and a .248 batting average.

Callix Crabbe - Stone Mountain High School. The 2000 Pirate graduate made his Major League debut in 2008, playing in 21 games as a second baseman for San Diego.

Jeff Abbott - Dunwoody High School. A five-year major league veteran, Abbott posted a .264 career average. Abbott played his first four years for the Chicago White Sox and one final season for the Florida Marlins in 2001. His best season came in 2000, where he posted a .274 batting average with three homers and 29 RBI.

Wally Joyner - Redan High School. Joyner retired during the 2001 season, his 16th in the major leagues. The former Raider star posted a .289 career batting average and accumulated 204 home runs, 1,106 RBI and 2,060 hits while also playing for the California Angels, Kansas City Royals, San Diego Padres and Atlanta Braves.

Michael Potts - Lithonia High School. The pitcher was originally signed by the Braves. He spent most of 1996 with Milwaukee going 1-2 in relief.

David Beard - Sequoyah High School. The pitcher

DEKALB PLAYERS IN COLLEGE BASEBALL

Three DeKalb County products saw action on the baseball diamond for Claflin University in the 2019 campaign.

Tucker's **Makai Holloway** (2017) sat at the top of that list, turning in a strong sophomore season on the mound.

Holloway ranked among the team pitching categories in several areas while starting six games and appearing in 14 total, finishing with a 5-4 record, 4.97 ERA and 44 strikeouts against only nine walks over 54 1/3 innings.

Columbia graduate **Jamal Devine** (2015) took to the mound in nine games including five starting assignments, registering a 1-1 record, 8.06 ERA, 15 strikeouts and 18 walks over 22 1/3 innings.

Southwest DeKalb's **Justin Josey** (2018) made his college debut and appeared in seven games including two starts, going 0-7 at the plate and scoring one run.

Two true freshmen earning immediate playing time in their college debut seasons at Morehouse a year ago.

Arabia Mountain's **Jalyn Hawkins** (2018) earned 31 starts and appeared in 33 games overall, tallying a .245 batting average, 22 runs scored, 22 RBI, one double and two stolen bases.

Hawkins also stepped in and served as a relief pitcher in four games, striking out nine and walking seven to go along with a 6.14 ERA and 0-0 record.

Tucker's **Miles Grayson** (2018) played in three games as a reserve outfielder and pitcher.

Grayson finished 0-8 with one run scored on the offensive side while also posting an 0-1 record with a 22.50 ERA, one strikeout and two walks over two innings pitched.

Clark Atlanta's 2019 roster featured four players with a DeKalb County background.

Joshua Oliver (2017) of Druid Hills registered the most impressive offensive numbers as a sophomore outfielder, tallying a .296 batting average, five RBI, four runs scored and one triple.

Columbia's **Khalil Manuel** (2017) joined Oliver in the outfield rotation, starting two games and seeing action in nine overall as a sophomore.

Manuel secured a .091 batting average, three runs scored, three RBI and two stolen bases.

Redan's **Jashaun Frank** (2018) also served as a reserve outfielder in his true freshman campaign, playing in one game and going 0-1 at the plate.

Arabia Mountain graduate Victor Brown (2016) served as one of the anchors of the Panther pitching rotation once again, going 3-2 with a 5.57 ERA while posting nine strikeouts and 11 walks over 21 innings.

Southwest DeKalb product **Kelvin Wimbish** (2014) closed out his college career with another strong showing at Albany State last spring.

The fifth-year senior infielder started 18 of the 29 games he appeared in, batting .271 with 11 runs scored, two RBI, two doubles and one stolen base.

Savannah State relied on the talents of a pair of Columbia graduates one final time a year ago.

DEKALB PLAYERS IN COLLEGE BASEBALL

Senior **Jalen Atterbury** (2015) started all 41 games he played in at second base, finishing with a .317 batting average, 31 runs scored, 26 stolen bases, 24 RBI and eight doubles.

Fellow Eagle product **Justin Washington** (2015) shined enough to earn a selection in the major league baseball draft while playing mainly as an outfielder.

Washington started 39 of the 40 games he saw action in, tallying a .242 batting average, 24 RBI, 23 runs scored, two homers, three doubles, one triple and 14 stolen bases.

Middle Georgia's lineup also featured two DeKalb County graduates playing in prominent roles.

Columbia's **Trenton Nash** (2015) followed up on a banner junior campaign in 2018 with a stellar senior season a year ago from his shortstop position.

Nash appeared in 56 games, registering a .330 batting average, 65 runs scored, 33 RBI, 26 doubles, six homers and three stolen bases.

Chamblee product **Christopher Burgess** (2015) saw action in 37 games as a redshirt junior, finishing with a .223 batting average, 25 RBI, eight runs scored, three homers and four doubles.

Georgia Gwinnett's roster in 2019 featured two players that may have shined brightest among former DeKalb County stars on the college level.

Chamblee graduate **Brent Burgess** (2015) posted monster numbers while seeing action as both a pitcher and shortstop.

The hard-throwing right-hander went 0-1 with a 4.42 ERA and 10 strikeouts over 6 1/3 innings on the mound.

His offensive numbers were even more impressive, as Burgess started 56 of the 57 games he played in and tallied a .347 batting average, 47 runs scored, 34 RBI, six homers, 18 doubles, one triple and seven stolen bases.

Redan's **Matthew Swain** (2015) was impressive enough as a senior to garner a selection as a pitcher in the major league draft.

The towering (6-7) right-hander registered a 4-1 record and 3.38 ERA in 2019, registering 28 strikeouts and 19 walks over 26 2/3 innings.

Lakeside's **Sean Mootrey** (2017) sat out the 2019 season at Georgia Gwinnett and will return as a redshirt sophomore battling for playing time at first base and third base next spring.

Dunwoody graduate **Evan Romeo** served as a reserve outfielder at Berry College a year ago, finishing with a .182 batting average, seven RBI, three runs scored and one triple.

A pair of siblings from Dunwoody represented DeKalb County on the Georgia College roster during the 2019 season.

Redshirt senior **Will Hudgins** (2014) played a variety of roles while being listed as a utility player, starting 26 of 35 games played and posting a .192 batting average, 19 RBI, 12 runs scored, four homers and three doubles.

Younger brother **Josh Hudgins** (2018) stepped right in and earned immediate playing time as a true freshman pitcher in the Bobcat bullpen.

Josh Hudgins saw action in 11 games, going 0-1 with a 6.87 ERA and registering 15 strikeouts and 11 walks over 18 1/3 innings.

The Seminole State College in Florida roster featured two former standouts from DeKalb County.

DEKALB PLAYERS IN COLLEGE BASEBALL

Arabia Mountain's **Corey King** (2018) proved to be an instant star in his college debut, starting 43 games as a true freshman second baseman.

King ranked among the team leaders in batting average (.362), runs scored (35), RBI (23), stolen bases (10) and doubles (7) to along with one triple.

Tucker's **Louis Davenport** (2017) also shined as one of the aces of the Seminole pitching staff.

Davenport started 11 games and appeared in 19 overall, posting a 6-2 record and 2.77 ERA to go along with 94 strikeouts and 31 walks over 78 innings pitched.

Columbia graduate **Keishaun Clark** (2015) headed up a solid contingent of three DeKalb County products on the Lane College roster in 2019.

The junior infielder-pitcher put together a stellar .422 batting average, 28 runs scored, 24 RBI, six doubles, two triples, two homers and five stolen bases on the offensive end.

Clark also saw as a relief pitcher, going 0-1 with a 6.17 ERA while striking out three batters over 5 2/3 innings.

Julius Morgan (2016) of Druid Hills played in 18 games as a junior first baseman at Lane College, posting a .211 batting average, eight RBI, seven runs scored, two homers, two doubles and one stolen base.

Southwest DeKalb's **Mario Alston** (2015) rounded out the list of former DeKalb stars on the Lane roster last spring.

Alston netted a 3-5 record, 6.58 ERA and 21 strikeouts and 19 walks over 38 innings as a pitcher and also finished with a .111 batting average, one RBI and one double on the batting end.

Alabama State featured two talented former DeKalb County products on the 2019 roster.

Stephenson's **Terrell McCall** (2015) again proved that he has the ability to pitch with anybody, starting one game and appearing in 16 overall.

McCall tallied a 2-1 record and 2.72 ERA, accumulating 36 strikeouts and eight walks to go with four saves over 36 1/3 innings.

Southwest DeKalb's **Channing Walker** (2017) appeared in nine games and started one, going 0-0 with an 8.66 ERA and adding seven strikeouts over 17 2/3 innings.

No fewer than three DeKalb County graduates played key roles for the Oglethorpe Stormy Petrels last spring.

Jack Bartlewski (2017) of Druid Hills led this contingent, shining as both as infielder and pitcher.

Bartlewski played in 40 games, tallying a .289 batting average, 27 RBI, 25 runs scored, five homers, 12 doubles, one triple and five stolen bases.

Dunwoody's **Shota Barbeau** (2017) saw action in 17 games as a reserve outfielder, batting .100 with six runs scored, three RBI, one double and two stolen bases.

Dunwoody product **Justin Kacena** (2016) appeared in 15 games as a sophomore pitcher, finishing 2-1 with a 6.94 ERA and adding 17 strikeouts and 15 walks over 23 1/3 innings.

Lakeside's **Nolan Wilson** (2017) turned in a solid redshirt freshman campaign as a pitcher for Virginia Tech in 2019.

DEKALB PLAYERS IN COLLEGE BASEBALL

Wilson started three games and appeared in 12 overall, going 0-0 with a 3.29 ERA while striking out 10 and walking eight over 13 2/3 innings.

The Eastern Kentucky roster featured two DeKalb County graduates in leading roles in 2019.

Miller Grove's **Daniel Harris** (2016) produced a stellar junior season as the starting shortstop in 56 games, netting a .271 batting average, 44 RBI, 36 runs scored, nine homers, six doubles, one triple and eight stolen bases.

Redan's **Lyndon Weaver** (2018) shined as a true freshman infielder, starting 15 of the 26 games he played in.

Weaver batted .172 with 13 runs scored, four RBI, three doubles and eight stolen bases.

Southwest DeKalb graduate **Javeon Cody** (2017) earned a call from the major league baseball draft in the 15th round following a super sophomore campaign as an outfielder at Alvin Community College.

Cody saw action in 52 games, finishing with a .349 batting average, 52 runs scored, 40 stolen bases, 37 RBI, nine homers, 11 doubles and three triples.

Redan product **Chayce Bryant** (2018) made an immediate contribution as a true freshman first baseman at Pensacola State in 2019.

Bryant appeared in 22 games, netting a .313 batting average, 10 RBI, eight runs scored, four homers, one triple and one stolen base.

Redan's **Hunter Todd** (2018) served as a reserve catcher in his freshman season at Florida A&M last spring, going 0-5 with two RBI in three games.

West Georgia Tech enlisted three DeKalb County graduates with extensive playing time a year ago.

Lakeside's **Khaalil King** (2016) shined brightest among this group, producing a .287 batting average, 19 runs scored, 30 stolen bases, seven RBI and one double while appearing in 37 games as a shortstop.

Lakeside product **Drew Hinton** (2016) battled injuries all season in his push to earn a starting role at catcher, playing in only 19 games overall and finishing with a .064 batting average, two doubles and one RBI.

Arabia Mountain's **Chris Sims** (2017) saw action in nine games as a reserve sophomore outfielder, receiving 17 at-bats over the year.

Tucker's **Jake Lovvorn** (2014) ended his college career at Young Harris, striking out eight and walking seven over six innings and four games.

Paine College received starting contributions from three players out of DeKalb County schools a year ago.

Cedar Grove's **Emmanuel Wilson** (2017) ranked among the team leaders in several categories while lining up as both an infielder and pitcher.

Wilson started 34 of 36 games in the infield, registering a .278 batting average, 17 runs scored, 13 RBI, seven doubles and two stolen bases.

The former Saint star also started seven games and appeared in 11 on the pitching end, going 1-5 with an 8.01 ERA to go along with 40 strikeouts and 35 walks over 51 2/3 innings.

Miller Grove's **John Hayes** (2017) earned 13 starting roles and played in 24 games overall as a sophomore infielder.

2019 SEASON IN REVIEW

Southwest DeKalb's romp into the second round of the state Class AAAAA playoffs served as the main highlight in a banner season for DeKalb County schools in 2019.

Coach **Tyrus Taylor** guided the Panthers to a first round triumph over Clarke Central (16-6 and 16-6), an historic state accomplishment that was last achieved in 1978.

The 41-year drought between state round advancements served as the longest among current DeKalb County schools, with Cedar Grove (1982) being the closest at 37 years.

One of a record 12 local squads to earn state berths, Southwest DeKalb first had to put together a banner regular season showing that included records of 16-4 overall and a region best mark of 13-1 in 5-AAAAA.

The Panthers would go on to fall to Riverwood in the second round of state by the respective scores of 11-4 and 15-0 to finish the season with the stellar final mark of 18-6.

Taylor (187-150) passed Devore (181-76) as the winningest coach in school history in a 15-3 decision over Lithonia April 10.

Redan joined Southwest DeKalb as the second local team to advance in the state playoffs with a memorable series triumph over Morgan County in the first round.

Coach **Alexander Wyche**'s Raiders had to survive a three-game battle that ended with Redan holding a narrow 30-28 advantage over the home team in runs scored.

Redan dropped a tough 12-11 decision in the first game of an opening day doubleheader, only to prevail by an identical one-run margin in the nightcap in a 6-5 thriller.

The third and deciding contest would likewise go down to the wire, with the Raiders escaping by a 13-11 final margin.

Redan realized the other end of a tough loss in a second round road series against Fannin County, falling in three games this time around.

The Raiders lost the opener by a 5-1 count, took the second game in a 7-6 fight and then came up just short by a 4-3 margin in the third contest in finishing 22-13 overall.

Lakeside in AAAAAAA, Dunwoody, Stephenson, Tucker and Martin Luther King Jr. in AAAAAA, Chamblee, Arabia Mountain and Lithonia in AAAAA, Druid Hills in AAAA and McNair in AA rounded out DeKalb County's list of state qualifiers.

Stephenson was the lone team in that contingent to push the first round series to three games, taking Lee County the full distance before coming up just short.

Redan graduate **Timothy Jones** coached Stephenson to a regular season crown in Region 4-AAAAAA, earning the right to host Lee County in the first round of state.

The Jaguars missed a golden opportunity to sweep Lee County in an opening day doubleheader, leading 4-0 heading into the sixth inning and 4-3 in the seventh.

Lee County erupted for three runs in the sixth and five in the seventh to prevail by an 8-4 margin that looked out of reach until the very end.

Stephenson bounced back to take the nightcap of the twinbill by a 6-3 county, but Lee County left little doubt in the third and deciding contest the next day while rolling to an easy 8-0 triumph that ended the memorable Jaguar season at 20-7.

McNair also realized a season to remember, one that ended with the first state playoff berth for the Mustangs since Ron Smith's 2001 team.

The Mustangs lost to Chattooga in the first round of the state Class AA tournament, but coach **Marcus Salter**'s program had plenty to be proud about in looking back on a 2019 season that ended with a 11-15 record after going 0-19-1 the year before.

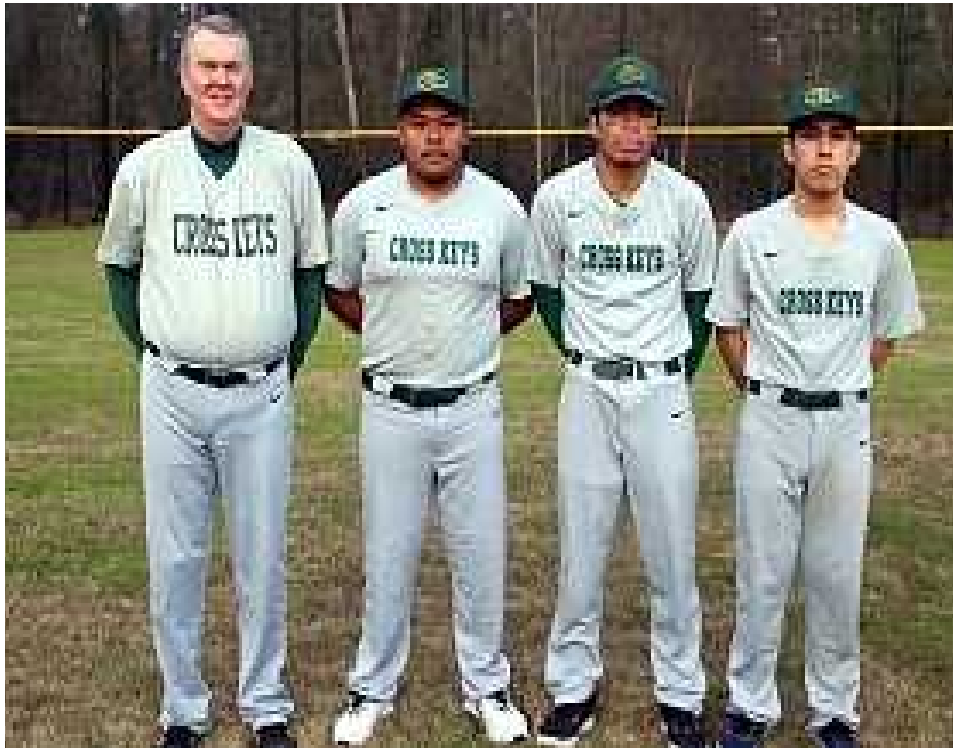

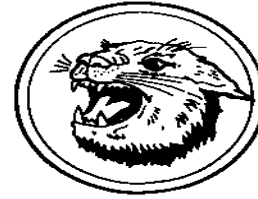

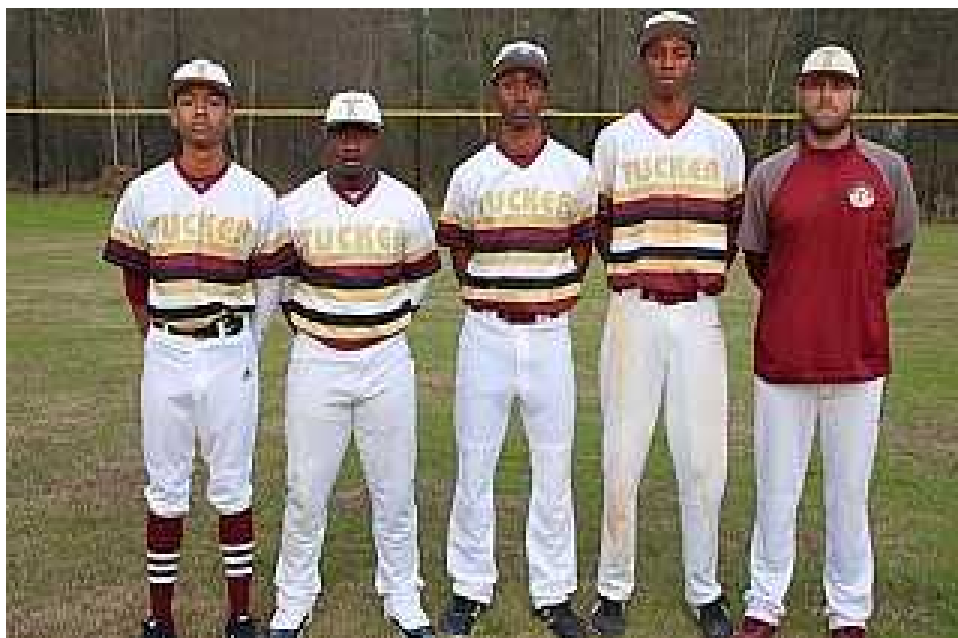

REMEMBERING A BASEBALL COACHING LEGEND

A true gentleman and an undisputed DeKalb County baseball coaching legend passed away quietly during the offseason.

Avondale High School graduate **Marvin Pruitt** finally moved up the coaching ladder to the place he truly belongs in heaven, ending a long battle with various illnesses.

The owner of one of the warmest smiles to ever grace the earth, Pruitt arrived on the local scene in the fall of 1977 and taught for 37 years through the 2013-14 campaign. Pruitt first put on a baseball uniform as a coach shortly upon graduation from Georgia State, making his initial mark as an assistant at Lakeside in the spring of 1978.

He earned his first high school head coaching role in baseball a year later as the lead skipper for the Viking junior varsity in 1979.

Moving up to the varsity in 1980, Pruitt served as an assistant coach for three years before finally earning his first high school head role from **Mike Trapani** in 1983.

Pruitt guided the Vikings to the first state playoff berth in school history and a single season mark for victories in a 22-11 campaign in his debut season.

Lakeside knocked off North Cobb (0-5; 12-1; 3-2) in the first round in earning what is still the only state semifinal berth in school history.

The Vikings dropped a 2-1 series to North Clayton in the AAAA semifinals, losing the first game by a 6-2 margin, winning the second (4-2) and then falling 11-8 in the finale. Pruitt went on to coach at Lakeside for three more years, producing strong records of 16-8 in 1984, 18-7 in 1985 and 13-9 in 1986 for a total four-year mark of 69-35.

The former Blue Devil next went to Rockdale County for six years before returning to DeKalb County as the head coach at Southwest DeKalb in 1993.

Pruitt once again worked his magic for a Panther program that had produced almost as many losing seasons (6) as winning marks (7) in the previous 13 years since last making the state playoffs in a 26-3 campaign under legendary coach **John Devore** in 1979.

Southwest DeKalb immediately rose up the local baseball ladder again, finishing 14-8 in 1993, 20-10-1 in 1994 and 19-10 in 1995 for a record of 53-28-1 over three years.

The 1994 season ended in the first state playoff berth for the school in 15 years, with the Panthers falling 5-4 to Newton County in the third game of a first round AAAA series.

Southwest DeKalb returned to the state field again in 1995, dropping another heart-breaking 5-4 decision in the third and deciding contest against Northwest Whitfield.

Following a year off from the coaching ranks in 1996, Pruitt surfaced for a third time as a head man in DeKalb County in 1997 at the newly created Stephenson High School.

A tough 3-18 season in his debut led to a gradual upward swing, with the Jaguars going 12-15 in 1998, 7-16 in 1999 and 12-11-2 in 2000 for a final record of 34-60-2.

Pruitt then headed to his final destination at Redan in 2001, leading to a glorious run of 14 years that has never been matched before or since.

The Raiders qualified for the state playoffs an amazing 13 times in the 14 years under Pruitt's leadership, with the lone exception being the 13-13 edition of 2009.

A doubleheader sweep of traditional power Marist (11-0 and 4-3) served as the most memorable moment of many, as the victories came in the championship round of the state Class AAAA playoffs in 2013.

Pruitt finished his spectacular stint as the Raider skipper with 13 winning seasons, a total record of 291-129-2 and a state playoff mark of 38-30. He was 510-333-6 overall.
